An Act Providing for the Submission to the People, for the Adoption or Rejection
of a Public Question

Shall the act entitled "An act authorizing the creation of a debt of the State of New Jersey by the issuance of bonds of the State in the sum of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00) for State Teachers' college buildings, their construction, reconstruction, development, extension, improvement, equipment and facilities for educational use; providing the ways and means to pay the interest of said debt and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof and providing for the submission of this act to the people at a general election," be approved?
